

# Massachusetts Bass Federation 2009 Trail Entry Form

The 2009 Massachusetts TBF/Bass Federation tournament trail will be an open trail. There is no age limit. Parent child or adult child teams are welcome to participate. Participants under the age of eighteen (18) must be paired with an angler of legal age who will assume responsibility in all matters. The Tournament Committee reserves the right to refuse any application. **THERE WILL STILL BE THE TRADITIONAL OFF LIMITS PERIOD OF MIDNIGHT THE TUESDAY BEFORE THE SCHEDULED TOURNAMENT DATE.** Pre registration for the trail is not necessary but remains an option. A pre registration fee of \$160 must be received or postmarked no later than Friday April 25, 2009. The first 50 pre registered entrants will be guaranteed a spot on the trail. The pre registration fee is non refundable and will be applied to the fourth tournament on the trail schedule (Winnepesaukee) and will wave any TOC entry fees. Any team that qualifies for the TOC that did not pre register for the trail will be assessed a \$160 entry fee for the TOC. Also, if you are not a member of the Mass Bass Federation/TBF and qualify for the TOC you will be required to join for a fee of \$45. This is just for the TOC. There will be a 50 boat limit at all tournaments. You may enter at any time up to the day of the tournament. However, if two weeks prior to the date of the tournament it appears there will not be a minimum of 25 boats the tournament will be capped at a 25 boat limit to avoid the EPO fee. Two weeks prior to the tournament the boat limit will be posted on the Mass Bass web site massbass.com. A waiver form must also be signed by all participants. This form can be found on the Mass Bass website. Checks will be accepted for pre registration ONLY. Checks may be made out and mailed to Daniel Jenkins, 202 River St, Hudson, MA 01749. All other fees are cash only. Any ramp and or parking fees will be collected separately at each event.

I hereby wave my rights of privacy or publicity with regard to the unconditional right to use my name, voice photographic likeness, video and biographical information and fishing tips and instructions in connection with any reproduction of same, video/audio productions and/or articles and press releases by TBF, its parent or affiliate companies, and those acting under their permission, anywhere at any time, through any medium or media. I shall not be entitled to receive any royalties or other compensation in connection with such use. I further understand and agree that the tournament officials reserve the right to reject my application for any reason.

# Massachusetts Bass Federation Trail Tournament Rules for 2009

These Tournament rules are subject to change at any time. For an updated copy go online to [www.massbass.com](http://www.massbass.com) or call the Mass Bass Federation Vice President/Tournament Director to get an updated copy.

**1. RULES:** The following rules shall apply to all Federation events. Interpretation of these rules shall be left exclusively to the Federation Tournament Committee. Tournament Officials (consisting of the Tournament Committee members only) shall be designated at all tournament sites. The Tournament Director has the final say on all matters at tournament site.

**2. PARTICIPATION AND ELIGIBILITY:** Participation in the Mass Bass Federation Tournament trail is open to all that meet all boating and insurance requirements. Proof of mandatory \$100,000 boating liability insurance is required to participate in all Federation events. Proof of insurance must be presented at time of registration. All tournaments are team events and shall consist of two persons per boat. Participants under the age of eighteen (18) must be paired with an angler of legal age who will assume responsibility in all matters.

**3. Registration:** All boats must be registered with the tournament official by 6:30 A.M. the official registration cut-off time. Tournament officials prior to the start of the tournament will do a full boat inspection. A number shall be assigned to every boat. There shall be only one official point for check out in the morning, and check in point in the afternoon, and this point shall be designated at the tournament briefing. Any boat that comes after 6:30 A.M will be allowed to fish but will be the starter boat. If a boat arrives after the tournament has started that boat will be allowed to fish so long as there is a worker at the site to check the boat and take entry money. An angler may fish alone but will only gain points for himself and will be limited to the number of fish he may weigh in.

**4. Pre-Tournament Practice:** The tournament waters will be off limits to all starting midnight Tuesday prior to the tournament until the start of the tournament. No contestant or Federation member shall fish or boat on the tournament waters during the official cut-off period beginning at midnight Tuesday. Contestants wishing to bring a boat across tournament waters from another site (campsite, etc.) must first obtain permission from the tournament director. Any infraction of this rule will be grounds for disqualification of that individual from all federation tournaments for one year or more. **For 30 days prior to and during the tournament a competitor cannot:**

- A. Be on the water with or solicit information from a known guide or local expert.
- B. Have the assistance or advice of a professional guide, state or federal wildlife agency employee, or any other person deemed a "local expert" on these tournament waters by the Tournament Director, unless he is a contestant in the tournament.

- C. Nor enter the tournament waters with anyone who has been on the tournament waters during an off-limit period or solicit information from anyone that has been on the tournament waters during the off limits.
- D. Each competitor agrees to report to the Tournament Director any violation or infraction of these Tournament Rules. The failure to report violations or suggestions to violate these rules or false verification of weigh-in forms will be cause for disqualification. The penalty for any infraction of this rule is a one-year or more suspension from all Federation events.

You must obey all state fishing regulations.

**5. Safety:** Safe boating conduct must be observed at all times by all competitors. Each competitor is required to wear a coast guard approved floatation device. This P.F.D. must be strapped, snapped or zipped securely any time the combustion motor is operating.

**6. Sportsmanship:** All tournament competitors are expected to follow the highest standard of sportsmanship, courtesy, safety and conservation. Any infraction of the fundamental principles of good sportsmanship or state fishing regulations may be deemed cause for disqualification. Maximum courtesy must be practiced at all times, especially with regard to boating and angling in the vicinity of non-competitors who are on the tournament waters. All bass must be caught alive and in a sporting manner. Any one caught intentionally snagging fish will be immediately disqualified and can face further disciplinary action from the Federation. Any act by a competitor, which reflects unfavorably upon the Society and Federation's effort to promote fisheries conservation, clean waters and courtesy shall be cause for disqualification. Drunkenness of any competitor during the tournament will not be tolerated and shall be cause for automatic disqualification from this and future Massachusetts Bass tournaments. No alcoholic beverages or any other depressants or stimulants, shall be tolerated in the boats or at the weigh-in areas.

**7. Tackle & Equipment:** Only artificial lures will be permitted. Live bait or prepared bait will not be permitted, with the exception of pork strips, rinds, etc. Only one rod (8 foot maximum length from butt or handle to rod tip) and reel may be used at one time (with up to two baits per line) per angler. Other rigs as specified above may be in the boat ready to use. No electronically controlled lures may be used.

**8. Horsepower Regulations:** Maximum horsepower for all outboard motors used in this competition will not exceed the horsepower limitation set by the U.S. Coast Guard in their ruling of Nov. 1, 1972. Each boat must have an U.S. Coast Guard horsepower rating plate attached to the boat by the manufacturer. Any boat manufactured prior to Nov. 1, 1972 must adhere to the rating set by the U.S. Coast Guard for similar boats. Each competitor agrees to submit, by their signature on the tournament registration form, the boat and outboard motor used in this tournament to an inspection by factory trained personnel, if there is any reason to suspect the horsepower is in excess of this rating. Normal maintenance to increase the performance of your motor is allowed. Changing or altering standard factory parts of your motor to increase the horsepower rating is forbidden.

**9. For the safety of all Contestants:** All gas-powered motors will be equipped with some type of ignition kill switch, which will be checked the morning of the tournament. **This ignition kill device MUST be attached to the driver any time the combustion engine is operating.** Fishing boats must be 13 feet or more in length. For blind draw tournaments, boats must be at least 15 feet in length, with adequate livewell(s). Trolling, as a method of fishing is prohibited. Canoes, barges, or similar cumbersome craft will not be permitted. No boat equipped with stick steering will be permitted to be used during tournament hours by any competitor. The tournament committee shall make the definition of stick steering. Tiller steering is permitted. All boats must have a current registration.

**10. Basic Boat Equipment:** Every boat shall be expected to have all state required safety equipment. All boats must have a functional live-well space properly aerated to adequately maintain alive a limit catch of bass by both contestants using the boat. Tournament officials shall have the sole responsibility of determining whether aeration and capacity is "proper and adequate". Boats that do not have factory installed gas tanks are restricted to a maximum of 18 gallons of gasoline in tanks that meet U.S. Coast Guard Regulations. Gas tanks must be properly secured or strapped in the boat.

**11. Permitted Fishing Locations:** Fishing on the tournament water is permitted anywhere except within 25 yards of another competitor's boat, which was first anchored. An anchored boat is defined as having the anchor in the water and the trolling motor out of the water. No such anchored boat shall permit selected competitors to fish within the 25 yards claimed by said boat. No boat will be permitted to drop anchor on another competitor's boat until that boat(s) has moved 50 yards away. Contestants may not depart their boat to land fish. Contestants must leave and return to official checkpoint by boat. Both competitors must remain in boat at all times except in case of dire emergency. If contestants must leave the boat to relieve themselves during tournament hours, they must ask another participating boat to witness them leaving and returning to their boat. No boat shall approach within reaching distances of another boat during the tournament except for an emergency.

**12. Scoring:** Tournament awards and final winners shall be determined by total weight. Only Largemouth, Smallmouth, Kentucky and Spotted bass will be weighed. The Tournament Director prior to the tournament shall determine the limit aggregate for team events. The prevailing statutes bind all competitors and regulations of said states. **At no time shall a competitor have in his possession more than the allowed Tournament limit. Culling is permitted, but must be done immediately. There will be no culling of fish at the ramp.** Once a competitor has checked in all fish are the property of the Tournament Director. All dead fish will be counted as part of your limit. The minimum length for bass shall be twelve (12) inches. Only bass as described above which measure (12) inches or more in length with mouth and tail closed shall be weighed in. Each fish weighed in less than twelve (12) inches will have one (1) pound deducted from the total weight and those fish will be disqualified. Any bass that appears to have been mangled, mashed, or mauled or otherwise altered will be weighed and credited only at the discretion of the tournament officials. Bass must not be placed on a stringer at any time during the tournament. Any Team fishing cannot share points if a team splits for any reason. No points will be shared by 2 Teams.

**13. Measuring Devices:** Due to the variance in measuring devices, a request to check your measuring device against the Official Measuring Device (Golden Rule) with no

penalty to the contestant, will be allowed. There will be no courtesy check for fish allowed.

**14. Penalty Points:** For each legal dead bass presented to the weigh-in officials, the competitor shall have four (4) ounces (or 0.25 lbs.) of weight deducted from his daily total. The tournament officials shall have sole authority for assessing penalty points. Competitors bringing more fish to the scales than the limit allowed in the tournament will have the weight of their largest fish plus one pound deducted from their total weight.

**15. Late Penalty:** Competitors who are not in the official checkpoint area as described in rule 3 at the appointed time shall be penalized. The penalty shall be at a rate of 1 pound per minute, to be deducted from the total weight of their catch that day. This will include any weight to be counted toward a Lunker award. After being fifteen minutes you are disqualified. All fishing must cease upon check-in. Exact starting and check-in times will be announced at the tournament briefing. If a boat in distress signals for assistance, you must stop and render assistance, and if nothing can be done, one team member from the distressed boat may bag the fish and be taken to the weigh-in. Anyone not stopping to help a boat in distress can be disqualified. Any boat that stops to help a boat in distress will not be disqualified if tournament officials feel said boat has proven they did stop to help a distressed boat. You should bring proof (if boat was not in the tournament) such as name and phone number of person helped.

**16. Ties:** Ties in weight will be decided by number of fish. If teams remain tied, Points and places will be combined and divided equally.

**17.** None of the above rules shall prohibit a properly designated tournament official from approaching or boarding any competitor's boat any time during the tournament hours.

**18. Protests/Complaints:** All contestants are required to report all complaints or violations against any competitor to the Tournament Director in writing prior to the presentation of awards at the tournament site. The Tournament Officials before the presentation of awards shall rule upon all violations and/or complaints. The President, or in his absence the Vice President, or either Tournament Trail Director, shall have the power to break a tie vote. No person presenting a protest, or person being protested against can take part in Tournament Committee voting, a substitute will be appointed in his or her place, if necessary.

**19. Special instructions may be in effect during any tournament when tournament Director deems it necessary.**

**20. Each competitor agrees to submit to a polygraph test should he be accused of any rule violation at any time after the tournament.** The administration and interpretation of the polygraph test shall be solely the responsibility of the Federation Tournament Director, and his Committee, and shall be used (or not used) at the discretion of the Tournament Committee. Without limiting the foregoing, the Tournament Committee shall have sole discretion to select the place, at which such polygraph test shall be administered, the individual who administers such polygraph test, and the scope of the questions, which may be asked during such test. The Participant shall be available, at his expense, at the location selected by the Tournament Committee and shall cooperate in all respects with such examination. Failure to take this test shall mean automatic disqualification.

**21. Violation of any of these rules listed shall be cause for disqualification.** All state boating regulations and applicable safety codes will be adhered to or face disqualification.

**22. Re: T.O.C.:** All those qualifying for and wishing to participate in the TOC must be or must become Massachusetts Bass Federation/TBF members. To qualify for the T.O.C. you must finish in the top fifty (50) percentile of the average number of teams fishing the four qualifying tournaments. The total number of teams to qualify will not exceed 25.

**23.** Any single person qualifying for the T.O.C. with up to four different partners will be allowed to choose the partner that he or she wants from one of these four partners. If a person fishes with a person for two tournaments, the qualifying angler must fish with that partner. (Unless other wise allowed by the Tournament Committee) If two anglers qualify together, they may not split up and take two spots in the TOC with other partners. They must fish together or only one may fish. If two partners cannot come to a mutual agreement than neither will be allowed to fish.

**24. RADIOS/CAMERAS:** During tournament hours, a competitor may not use a CB radio, a VHF marine band radio, a cellular phone, or any other type of communications device for the purpose of locating or catching fish. Contestants are permitted to transmit by radio or telephone only in the event of an emergency or for business or personal reason not related to fishing. If so equipped, contestants may listen to the marine band weather information. Cameras are not allowed for use during official tournament hours.

**25. State Championship:** The State Championship has some differing rules that are not included in these rules.
